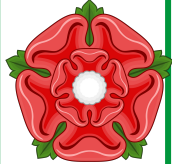


# The Tudors - Year 5 - Terms 5 & 6

Jobs

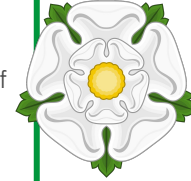


## Impact on our lives today

The **Royal Mail** and **Royal Navy** began in the Tudor age.



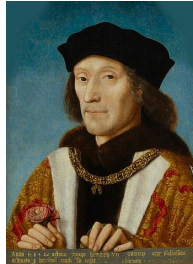
## Our Local Area

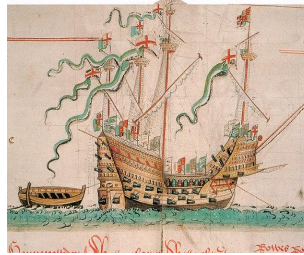

# Vocabulary



Protestant	A branch of Christianity called Protestantism. This religion began during Tudor times as Henry VIII broke away from the Catholic church in Rome.
Reformation	A 16th-century movement for the reform (change) of the Roman Catholic Church.
Monarch	A king or a queen.
Monastery	A building where monks live.
Century	A period of 100 years.
Catholic	A person who belongs to the Roman Catholic Church.
Dissolution	The dissolving of an institution (such as the church.)
Execution	The act of putting someone to death after sentencing.
Dynasty	A succession of closely related people who inherit power.
